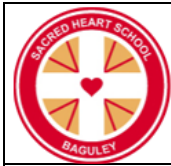

### Unit 6.2 Justice

#### Justice

Is a concept that means people behave in a way that is fair, equal and balanced for everyone

#### Injustice

The practice of being **unjust** or unfair

#### CAFOD

The Catholic Agency For Overseas Development

#### Refugees

A person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster.

#### Fairness

Impartial and just treatment or behaviour without favouritism or discrimination..

#### Developed world

A country with a lot of industrial activity and where people generally have high incomes.

#### Fair-trade

Trade between companies in developed countries and producers in developing countries in which fair prices are paid to the producers.

#### Charity

The voluntary giving of help, typically in the form of money, to those in need.

#### Advent wreath

A Christian tradition that symbolizes the passage of the four weeks of **Advent** in the liturgical calendar.
