# Unit 3.1 The Christian Family

#### Christian

A person who believes that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. Those who follow in the teaching of Jesus are Christians.

## **Baptism**

Baptism is a **Sacrament** where infants are **baptised** to welcome them into the Catholic Faith and free them from the original sin they were born with.

#### Sacrament

A sacred event (which was demonstrated when Jesus was on the earth) in which God's love and grace is given with the help of the Holy Spirit.

#### **Bible**

The Bible is a library of books. It is divided between the Old Testament and the New Testament. There are 66 books in the Bible.

#### Church

A building where Christians meet to worship. It is a holy and sacred place for Christians.

# **Priest**

A member if the Church who looks after the Parish Community. He says Mass and gives Spiritual guidance to people.

# <u>Diocese</u>

The Bishop supervises a diocese which is an area of land where there are lots of Churches. The bishop gives more spiritual guidance to a Priest.

## **God parents**

Make promises on behalf of a baby during Baptism.

## **Baptism Font**

Holds the water during the Baptism of a baby.
