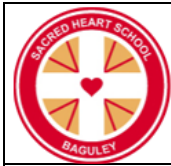

Unit 5.2 God's Covenants

Old Testament

The first part of the Christian Bible, made up of 39 books.

Covenant

An agreement, usually formal, between two or more persons to do with something specified.

Contract

A written or spoken agreement that is enforceable by law.

Abraham

Abraham was a keen follower of God. He obeyed God's commands and was willing to sacrifice his son.

Noah

Noah was a good man, a man of integrity – he was honest and upright. He built an ark as commanded by God and remained on the ark for 40 days and nights with his family.

Exodus

The departure of the Israelites from Egypt.

Ten Commandments

The laws or rules handed down to Moses by God on Mount Sinai.

Mount Sinai

The mountain at which the Ten Commandments were given to Moses by God.

Eternal

Lasting or existing forever, without end.

- How might people feel when making covenants?
